Rally Japan: Notes

Information for international travelers:

- * At the airport, as you leave the baggage claim area you will be asked to present your luggage tag for all luggage that was checked through. This is the small piece of paper (sticker) that was given to you at the same time as your boarding pass, and that has a number matching the number on your luggage.
- * International driver's licenses will be required for all people who are driving in Japan (including competitors), unless they have a valid Japanese driver's license.
- * Cash: ATMs are open for limited hours. The ATM accepts most major credit cards, in addition to Cirrus, Maestro and Plus for direct bank transfers. The ATM is open from 0900-1900hrs weekdays and 0900-1700hrs on weekends. ATMs other than the Post Office, however, are not open on weekends and furthermore do not accept international cards.

The ATM's locate at the Seven Eleven convenience stores accept foreign-issued credit cards for cash advance for 24 hours

- * Day 1, 2 and 3 utilise the Do-oh Expressway that charges a fee for use. To make it easy the payment procedure, an Electronic Toll Collection system (ETC) equipment and an ETC card will be lent to all of foreign registered competition cars during the rally. - * It is wise to expect to pay for most daily expenses in cash (JPY). Hotels and large shops will accept credit cards, but often smaller convenience stores, petrol stations and restaurants will only accept Japanese credit cards.

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ATTENTION!

There are some road rules in Japan that differ from international standards, but that will be strictly enforced. In particular:

Road signs generally comply with the international system, with the exception of stop signs which are an inverted triangular shape (similar to 'Give W ay' signs in other countries).

All cars must stop at EVERY railway crossing and watch for trains, before proceeding.

Don't exceed the speed limit which is 40km/h in built up areas, unless otherwise indicated, and 60km/h elsewhere. Speed limits on expressways are 70km/h or 100km/h depending on conditions.

Also, international visitors should be aware that a valid Japanese license or International Driving Permit is required for driving on public roads. International Driving Permits MUST be issued under the 1949 Geneva Traffic Convention and this will be stated on the front of the document. Please contact the organisers if you are unable to obtain such a license. German, French, Swiss, Italian, Belgian or Taiwanese driving license holders may request a translation of their license from JAF. The combination of this translation and your driving license is valid as an alternative to the 'Geneva Convention' International Driving Permit. Except the above driving license holders will be required to switch your license to Japanese one (Gaimen Kirikae).

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

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1. Introduction / Welcome



1.1 Introduction from Chairman, Organising Committee

Welcome to Rally Japan 2010.

After two-years break we are very glad to be back to run the sixth edition of Rally Japan in the central part of Hokkaido. The last event, which attracted the attention of the rally world by the unique Super Special Stage held inside of the Sapporo Dome stadium, was a great success. This year we are aiming at holding an even better organized rally, setting new event environmental approach standards for the whole championship.

The competition will start on Thursday, 9 September with a Super Special Stage in Sapporo. On September 10 and 11 the rally will run around the cities of Tomakomai, Chitose and Eniwa. On Sunday, 12 September the route goes to the towns of Sunagawa, Bibai and Naie.



This year we have managed to create an even more compact route incorporating highways. Again, we will use the world-famous Sapporo Dome as the base for the Super Special Stage. The course of the Stage, however, has been modified to make it even more challenging and technical for the drivers and more fun to watch for the spectators. The HQ, which was located at the Sapporo Dome last time, has been moved to the near located Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome. This will allow the spectators to use the Sapporo Dome parking lot, which was not possible in 2008. We will also set up a larger merchandising area at the Service Park.

As always, Rally Japan enjoys the great support from the people of Hokkaido, the volunteers, who come to help from all over the country, and of course the FIA and JAF officials. I would also like to thank those, who made the use of the Sapporo Dome possible this year.

With the recent worldwide economic recession these are challenging times for all events, however, we believe it gives us a perfect chance to create a new look for WRC. We will do our best to live up to the expectations of the fans and officials who have been supporting us so far. We look forward to seeing all of you around the Rally Japan stages in September!

The first WRC event took place in Japan in 2004. After being held in Tokachi region of Hokkaido four times, Rally Japan moved to the island's biggest city – Sapporo, in 2008. The last event attracted the record number of spectators – 540.700 people, thus making it the most visited motorsport event in the country.

After taking a break in 2009 due to the change in the FIA regulations, Rally Japan returns in 2010 to be held for the sixth time. Once again, the rally route is set out in the central part of Hokkaido, the Do-oh region. The stages are located around six cities and one town – Sapporo, Chitose, Eniwa, Tomakomai,

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Sunagawa, Bibai and Naie. The areas around Sunagawa and Naie will be used for the first time.

During the 2008 event Sapporo Dome became the 'hub' of the rally, with all main facilities located there. This year, however, the HQ and the Service park will move to the Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome, located approximately 2.5 km away from the Sapporo Dome. The rally HQ, the media centre, the scrutineering site and the Service park will all be located at this 120 thousand square meters facility. Sapporo Dome, a state-of-the-art weatherproof stadium with a sitting capacity of almost fourty-three thousand, will once again host the Super Special Stage. A course with a jump and a tunnel will be built on the arena giving the spectators a chance to enjoy the world's only simultaneous two-cars rally competition under a roof. The Super Special Stage will be the rally opener on Thursday and will be held everyday of the rally, four times in total. Since the parking lot of the Sapporo Dome will not be used this year there will be sufficient space for the spectators' cars.

One more change for 2010 is the use of the new spectator-oriented stage in Sunagawa instead of the one near the New Chitose airport in 2008. The Sunagawa stage is often used in All Japan Dirt trial Championship (Japanese unique motorsport) and other motorsport events. It has a lot of areas for spectators to and a better road surface.

1.3 Information about Sapporo / Hokkaido

Hokkaido is the northernmost island of Japan, and has a population of 5.57 million. Comparing the population density to the main island of Honshu, Hokkaido has 67 people per square km and Honshu has 334 per square km, so it is relatively sparsely populated. The island has vast areas of forest, mountains and agricultural land.

The area is relatively recently settled by the ethnic Japanese, who came up from the south approximately 200 years ago. Local demographics followed a pattern set in other countries, where the local indigenous population declined. The indigenous people are called AINU and are believed to have come down the Kamchatka Peninsula from Siberia. Names of the most cities and towns in Hokkaido derive from the language of the indigenous people of the area – the Ainu. All of the Special Stage names are also based on the Ainu language.

It is located north of the Korean peninsula, though surprisingly in latitude is similar to Rome and south of Great Britain. It is affected by the south flowing current of the Pacific Ocean, which brings long and cold winters. Also there is some effect from the summer typhoons, although this is usually only rainfall. The Do-oh region, which includes Sapporo, is located on the Ishikari plains. There are two mountainous ranges in the area - one in the east and another in the southeast part.

Sapporo city is one of the Japan's major cities with the fifth biggest population of 1.89 million people. It hosted the winter Olympic Games in 1972. In 2008 the G8 Summit was held near Lake Toya, Not so far from Sapporo.

Do-oh region has very good transport infrastructure. For example, Shin-Chitose Airport, the closest international airport from the city, is used by more than 18 million people a year. From here planes fly to more than 30 national and 10 international airports.

The city of Tomakomai, where some of the stages are located, is a large sea port capable of accepting large international oil tankers and sea ferries from all over Japan. Expressways connect Sapporo, Shin-Chitose and Tomakomai.

5. Service Park



5.1 Information about the Service Park

There will be one central Service Park adjacent to the Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome (N43 01.640' E141 24.746') where HQ and Media Centre are also placed. All surface is asphalt. There is limited infrastructure built into the area, and the Organisers can provide additional facilities.

Bump into the Service Park will be from Saturday 4 September.

5.2 Facilities at the Service Park

General facilities available at the Service Park are as follows:

- Public toilets

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- General lighting
- Water taps for shared use
- 5 x 10m space per competitor, unless agreed otherwise. If competitors have a special requirement for space, due to large service vehicles or a sea container they should contact the Organisers.

The following facilities and services can be ordered through the Organisers for use in the Service Park. These items can be ordered using the order form that is included in the Entry Booklet in Rally Guide 1 Appendix D 3.

Booking Conditions

To guarantee delivery, all items must be ordered by Wednesday 18 August. Goods ordered will be delivered to the Service Park on or before the stated 'start date' and collected on Monday 13 September. Credit card details are required, regardless of method of payment, and will be used for payment if the items are not returned or damaged. Additionally there will be a small fee for transport, please confirm the total amount with the organisers, which depends on overall orders for the event and what type of truck is used to deliver the equipment.

5.3 Service Park Guidelines

The following is in addition to the Article 47 of the WRC Sporting Regulations 2010.


- * Competitors may bring their auxiliary vehicles into the Service Park, as long as they can park them within their designated area. Otherwise these vehicles must be taken to the auxiliary parking area adjacent to the Service Park. Two service vehicle plates will be issued per competitor. Extra auxiliary plates can be ordered for JPY30,000. To allow access to the Service Park all vehicle passes, including Service and Auxiliary vehicle passes must be displayed on the top of the front windscreen on the passenger's side.
- * Credential passes must be worn in all areas in the Service Park, except spectator areas.
- * All vehicle traffic will be in the directions shown on the maps. All those who are travelling in the Service Park by vehicle must obey the directions of event marshals.

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- * All power cables and junction boxes are for existing lighting only and are not to be used by service crews (unless authorised by the Service Park Commander).
- * Carwash a rally car washing service is provided at every return to service in a vehicle wash area within the Service Park.



The use of two-way radios is strictly controlled in Japan. The applications for two-way radio use are no longer accepted at the time of publishing of Rally Guide 2.



Please see Rally Japan Supplementary Regulations Articles 7 and 8.



8.1 National laws / customs clearance

As internal shipping and freight charges can be expensive, Rally Japan organisers recommend that all sea freight be imported through the closest Port of Tomakomai. Customs authorities of Hokkaido are familiar with customs procedures for overseas team competing at Rally Japan. Container transportation from Tomakomai to the service park takes about one hour.

The general principles of customs clearance are as follows:

- (1) FIA CARNET is required and mandatory for all overseas registered cars that are to be driven on the public roads in Japan i.e. rally car, recce car, service van, other cars. The CARNET will be provided by each country's ASN. A carnet certification document will be provided by JAF. that serves as temporary compliance and this should be carried with the CARNET within the vehicle. Every automobile (including rally cars and every foreign registered vehicle) which is driven on public road in Japan has to be covered by Jibaiseki which is a compulsory insurance.
- **Note**: When a temporarily imported vehicle is registered in a country that is not a party to the 1949 Geneva Convention, it must be inspected and registered in Japan on arrival, even if imported under **FIA CARNET**. The inspection requires time and payment of a fee. For more information please contact KURIBAYASHI Co. Ltd. (details below).
- (2) **ATA CARNET** can be used for the following for tools/parts/tyres (these are re-exported), and promotional items. All of the items imported under **ATA** Carnet are to re-exported after the rally. Even if

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it is temporary, the import of Contraband goods is prohibited.

(3) **PRO FORMA INVOICE** - please check with the Organisers or your freight agent on use of pro-forma invoices.

You are required to submit the required documents when you get the special permits which are required for the importation of hazardous goods such as high pressure gas cylinders, and for medical supplies. You are also required to arrange the importation of the items by yourself.

It is recommended that anyone wishing to import vehicles and goods for Rally Japan contact the official freight agents for Rally Japan

Vehicles temporarily registered for Rally Japan have to comply with the Japanese Road Vehicles Act and the Japanese Road Traffic Law and the provision of the JAF National Sporting Regulations for Vehicles (lighting devices, noise generated by the car, etc) except when Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code differs.

For vehicles that are not already registered in Japan, two documents are required and must be carried in the vehicles and a third is recommended for competition vehicles:

- (a) A translation of the Carnet certification document, issued by JAF and distributed by the Organisers. This document serves as a temporary vehicle compliance document. For rally cars this is included in the entry fee, however for other vehicles a small processing fee will be charged
- (b) 'Jibaiseki'. It is a compulsory insurance. So, every automobile (including rally cars and every foreign registered vehicle) which is driven on public road in Japan has to be gotten it. A fee of approximately JPY6,000 will apply for other vehicles that are not registered in Japan.
- (c) Rally car insurance in Third party insurance. This is recommended for rally cars and recce cars. The fee is approximately JPY20,000 depending on engine size.

The Entry Booklet in Appendix D of Rally Guide 1 contains a section on importing vehicles. Vehicle details are required for documents (b) and (c) above.

8.2 The conditions for driving in Japan

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International visitors should be aware that a valid Japanese license or International Driving Permit is required for driving on public roads. International Driving Permits MUST be issued under the 1949 Geneva Traffic Convention and this will be stated on the front of the document. Please contact the organisers if you are unable to obtain such a license. Swiss, German, Italian, Belgian, French or Taiwanese driving license holders may request a translation of their license from JAF. The combination of this translation and your driving license is valid as an alternative to the 'Geneva Convention' International Driving Permit. Except the above driving license holders will be required to sit a driving test or switch your license to Japanese one (Gaimen Kirikae). 

All helicopters flying in support of the rally must be registered with the organisers. There will be a standard protocol for Rally helicopters in Rally airspace and only registered aircraft will be permitted to fly in this space. A helicopter registration fee will be charged.

The form for helicopter registration is included in Rally Guide1. It should be returned to the Rally Permanent Secretariat by Wednesday, 25 August

A schedule of landing sites and GPS locations will be available, which will include the special stages and Service Park.

Attendance at the pilots' briefing is obligatory for all pilots.

12. Reconnaissance



12.1 Registration for reconnaissance and schedule

- 12.1.1 All competitors participating in reconnaissance must submit the details of their registered vehicles prior to commencing reconnaissance. At this time they will be issued with a reconnaissance pass and a vehicle identification card. The vehicle identification card must be displayed on the left rear side window.
- 12.1.2 Schedule

Please refer to Appendix A.3

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12.2 Rules to be observed by Crews

- 12.2.1 Vehicles used for reconnaissance must comply with Article 25.1 of the FIA WRC Regulations
- 12.2.2 The vehicle identification card must be displayed on the left rear side window. It will be checked by an official at the start of each stage.
- 12.2.3 Crews are allowed to have 2 passes at the most through each stage. Stages, which are used more than once in the Rally are considered to be one stage.
- 12.2.4 During the reconnaissance the crews must observe the traffic regulations. The speed limit in all stages is 60 km/h. Crews must be considerate of other vehicles on the road. Rally officials may observe the crews behavior by the means of measuring equipment, photo and video cameras. Any violations by the crews will be reported to the Stewards.

12.3 Installation of the speed observing device

Cars of competitors nominated in a Bulletin will be fitted with speed observing devices. The devices will be handed out at the Rally HQ on Monday, 6 September from 17:00 to 19:00 hrs.



13. Scrutineering, sealing and marking



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13.1 Installation of the speed observing device

The marking and sealing of the gear boxes/differentials including spares as well as sealing of turbo charges including spares, will be held according to the scrutineering schedule or upon a previous appointment with the FIA Technical delegate.

13.2 Before Scrutineering

Competitors should bring the car to the entrance of the scrutineering site in accordance with the Scrutineering Schedule and follow the officials' instructions. In case the area in front of the entrance is too congested to present the vehicle to the scrutineers at the allocated time, a team member should inform a marshal at the scrutineering venue.

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Competition numbers, rally plates and organisers advertisement must be attached to the competiton vehicles by the time of scrutineering. Please refer to attachment 4 of the Supplementary regulations for allocation of the competition numbers, rally plates and advertising.

All competitors must have FIA safety tracking devices and emergency buttons installed and functioning confirmed by the time of scrutineering. Please refer to Appendix D for installation instructions. The tracking device is the same type as used in previous years.

The following documents/items have to be presented at the scrutineering:

Official Scrutineering sheet: distributed to competitors upon completion of the verification of the documents

Car registration documents

Homologation documentation with all attachments

Helmet, racing suits, safety underwear, socks, balaclava, racing shoes, gloves (not necessary for co-driver).

Competitors must be fully aware of the requirements of the International Sporting Code Appendix J, in particular Articles 252 and 253, as well as Article 11 of Rally Japan Supplementary Regulations.

13.3 Nomination of tyres

In accordance with Article 61.3 and Appendix V of the FIA World Rally Regulations, P1 and P2 competitors, entered by Manufacturers or WRC teams must submit the barcodes list to the FIA by Wednesday, 8 September 1800hrs.

13.4 Collection and return of the FIA safety equipment

The FIA safety equipment will be distributed to competitors at the Competition Secretariat at Rally HQ on Tuesday, 7 September from 17:00 to 19:00 hrs. In case of an early retirement all equipment must be returned to the ISC-T office at the Service Park. All other vehicles will have the equipment removed at the Final Parcferme. Please refer to Appendix D for installation instructions.

18.2.4 Photographer's Accreditation

Photographers' applications must follow the same guidelines as stated above. Publications or agencies applying for single round accreditation must supply evidence of independent coverage of a minimum 15 pictures per pass issued at each event they have been accredited to in the previous year's Championship. The number of international "media photographer" passes will not exceed 30 at each event. The number of national "media photographer" passes will not exceed 12 at each event.

18.2.4.1 Commercial Photographers'

Non media photographers (team photographers, sponsor photographers etc) must apply for accreditation through: **North One Sport Accreditation Service**

18.2.5 Principles

- 1) A maximum of two representatives (journalists and/or photographers) per publication or agency will be accredited. A publication must have a circulation whose size and quality fulfill the criteria of the FIA and be on sale to the public. Club and internal magazines cannot be accredited as media.
- 2) Advertising, public relations, marketing or sponsor representatives must be addressed to **North One Sport Accreditation Service.**
- 3) The central and local offices of the major international press agencies (AP, AFP, Reuters, ANSA, UPI, DPA, LUSA, BELGA, JIJI, KYODO, EFE, Press Association, SAPA, Australian AP, APA etc.), will always be accredited by the FIA.

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18.2.6 Documentation to be submitted with each application

- A formal request for accreditation written on the publication's official letterhead, signed by the Director
 of the publication or the Chief Editor. Requests signed by the clerical stuff will not be accepted. A formal



20.1 Medical facilities

Sapporo Medical University Hospital and Sapporo Higashi Tokushukai Hospital is nominated the executive hospital for Doctor Heli carrying patients during the rally. It is located in the center of Sapporo. The hospitals are staffed with doctors specializing in emergency intensive care, and also has specialized staff in all areas as an advanced critical care center.

Sapporo Higashi Tokushukai Hospital is located 5 minutes away from the helicopter base at Okadama airport. Injury center is on standby 24 hours.

Emergency Medical Treatment Information Center is also available for searching the closest medical care facilities like hospitals and clinics in the case of sudden illness. In the case of sadden illness nighttime, Yakan Kyubyou Center is available between 1900hrs and 0700hrs (Next morning).

20.3 Towing service & Vehicle Recovery Hotline

The following procedures should be followed if your rally car is stopped on the stage and there are no injuries; and you have decided you cannot continue the stage.

If there is mobile phone coverage - call the recovery hotline to discuss recovery of the vehicle. If there is no mobile phone coverage - wait for the Sweeper.

Rally cars that have stopped on the stage will be taken off the stage by the Organisers and left at a central location. The GPS points of these central locations will be available for the teams.

Either the crew themselves, or a member of the team should ring the recovery HOTLINE.

Two questions that the Recovery HOTLINE person will ask are:

- (1) How will you be bringing the car back to the service park do you want the organisers to bring it back or will you make your own arrangements?; and
- (2) What team members, if any, will accompany the car?

From the central location, the car will be brought back by the organisers once all the cars are off the stage, or it can be brought back independently by the team. If your team wishes to make its own arrangements to bring the car back from the central location, there is a list of tow truck companies listed in under 'Car Transporters' in the Business Directory, in Section 21.9

21.4 Travel to and from Sapporo

21.4.1 To Shin Chitose Airport by Air

From Tokyo / Narita - Just a few direct flights are provided by JAL and ANA in a day. In many cases, you are required to move to Haneda Airport to catch domestic flight for Shin Chitose Airport. Taking an Airport Limousine bus from Narita Airport to Haneda Airport is the best way. The transfer costs JPY3,000 and the transportation takes 75 min. Tickets are available from the Airport Limousine / Information desk that is against the opposite wall as you come out of the arrivals hall. Keisei limited express or express trains are also available to move to Haneda other than the bus transportation.

From Tokyo / Haneda - 4 air companies - JAL, ANA, Air Do (ADO) and Sky Mark (SKY) have services between the two airports. In total there are more than 50 in a day. The flight time is approximately 1 and a half hours. Please note that there are some differences in air fares, the possible period of reservation and departure times between the companies.

From Osaka/Kansai - About 10 flights travel regularly every day from Osaka/Kansai to Shin Chitose Airport by JAL and ANA.

From other airports: There are 10 flights from international airports (Korea, China, Taiwan, Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, Guam and others) and more than 30 flights from other domestic airports every day.

21.4.2 Tomakomai by ferry

From Tokyo / Mito: Shosen Mitsui Ferry company services between Tomakomai and Oarai (Mito) with 2 large ferryboats every day. It takes about 19hrs (Ex: Departure 1830 hrs arrives at 1330 hrs on next day). An express way is available to move from Tokyo to the nearest IC (Mito Oarai IC: Kita Kanto Express way) to Oarai bay.

From Tokyo / Sendai: Taiheiyo Ferry company services between Tomakomai and Sendai with some large ferryboats every day. It takes about 14hrs and 20 min (Ex: Departure 1900 hrs arrives at 0920 hrs on next day). An express way is available to move from Tokyo to the nearest IC (Sendai kou Kita IC) from the Sendai ferry terminal. There is about 10 min time distance between Sendai kou kita IC and the ferry terminal.

From Tohoku / Hachinohe: Silver Ferry company services between Tomakomai and Hachinohe (Aomori pref.) with 4 large ferryboats every day. It takes about 9hrs (Ex: Departure 1300 hrs arrives at 2200 hrs).

From Chubu / Nagoya: Taiheiyo Ferry company services between Tomakomai and Nagoya with some large ferryboats every day. It takes about 38hrs and 20 min via Sendai (Ex: Departure 1900 hrs arrives at

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0920 hrs on after next day).

From Kansai / Tsuruga: Shin Nihonkai Ferry company services between Tomakomai Higashi and Tsuruga with some large ferryboats every day. It takes about 19hrs and 15 min (Ex: Departure 0115 hrs arrives at 2030 hrs).

From Tohoku / Nigata: Shin Nihonkai Ferry company services between Tomakomai Higashi and Sendai with 5 large ferryboats every week.

From Tohoku /Akita: Shin Nihonkai Ferry company services between Tomakomai Higashi and Sendai with 5 large ferryboats every week.

21.5 Access to Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome and Sapporo Dome

21.5.1 From Shin Chitose Airport

Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome (previously known as Tsukisamu Green Dome) is a located 2.5 km away from the Sapporo Dome.

There is a bus service from New Chitose Airport to the central Sapporo (takes approx. 70 min), which stops near the Sapporo Dome and the subway Fukuzumi station (10 minutes on foot to Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome). The one way fare is JPY1000. There are 4 services an hour during the day time and the travel time to Fukuzumi station is approximately 40 min.

Japan Railways Co. has services between the JR Shin Chitose Airport Station and JR Sapporo Station for JPY1,040 (one way). In case of taking Airport express train, the travel time to Sapporo Station is about 36 min. The nearest station to Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome and Sapporo Dome is Shin-Sapporo Station.

In case of taking a Taxi or hiring a car, take the Do-oh Express way from Chitose IC and then exit at Sapporo-Minami IC or Kita-Hiroshima IC.

21.5.2 From JR Sapporo Station

Take the subway (Toho line) to the terminal station Fukuzumi. It takes about 13min with the cost of JPY 240. The time distance from the terminal station to Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome and Sapporo Dome is about 10 min on foot. In the case of taking a taxi, it takes about 30 min.

21.5.3 From Tomakomai Bay

Take the Do-oh Express way from Tomakomai-Higashi IC, and then exit at Sapporo-Minami IC or Kita-Hiroshima.

In the case of coming from Tomakomai-Higashi Bay, Atsuma IC of Hidaka Express way is the nearest.

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21.5.4 Express way

There is substantial express network in Do-oh region. Ususally, Sapporo-Minami IC or Kita-Hiroshima IC is the most convenient to reach Hokusho Kurotech Tsukisamu Dome and Sapporo Dome. [NEXCO East Japan: http://www.e-nexco.co.jp]

Buy a cheap handset and pre-paid phone card from any convenience store. The cost is approximately JPY4,000 for the handset and phone cards are available in a variety of JPY amounts. The cost of calls is JPY 85 (30 second to France in day time) international and JPY 2 per second for local calls.

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Public Phones

International calls can be made from grey, or brown/green coloured public telephones located in hotels and passenger terminals. JPY1,000 notes are required to buy phone cards to use the phones. Vending machines for phone cards are always located close to the phones.

Internet Connections

Almost all hotels have internet connections from hotel rooms, or an outlet in their business centre. The grey and brown/green public telephones are also fitted with modem sockets, providing an inexpensive means of connection to the Internet. The brown/green type also has infra-red modem connection capability. Many cafes also have modem sockets.
